His Story

Henry Beaver was born in 1879 to Frederick (a general labourer) and Elizabeth Beaver and in 1881 they were living at 101 Cross Lane Salford.

By 1891 he had moved to live with his grandmother Fanny Beaver at 35 Cross Lane, Salford. He was aged 11 and at school.

In the 1901 he was living at 37 Crown Street, Pendleton aged 21 and a general labourer. He had been married to Laura (aged 18) for over a year and they had a son, Frederick, and a daughter Edith. By 1911 he is a wallpaper stainer and living at Pendleton aged 31.

He moved to Holmes Chapel after this time to work at the new wallpaper works which had opened on Macclesfield Road. He was living at 4 London Rd when he enlisted.

His War Record

Enlisted at Northwich 16/3/1917 aged 37 and just before his son Frederick (see 16). Posted 3rd Battalion Cheshire Regiment nr 62077. He joined the British Expeditionary Force on 20th June 1917 as a private. He was transferred to the 2/7th Battalion of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment on the 14th July 1917 with nr. 29478.

On 21st of February 1919 he was demobilised from the army having been wounded.
