His Story

John was born in 1892 to John (who was a highways labourer) and Harriet Blease (who was married for the second time) in Holmes Chapel.

In 1911 the family were living at Macclesfield Road Church Hulme and John, aged 19, was a miller's labourer.

His War Record

According to the Parish Magazine John joined the Royal Field Artillery in October 1914 and was serving abroad in August 1915.

In May 1918 he was in hospital 'again' (no details of previous time) and was discharged in July 1918. He may have had a further hospital visit in September but was discharged from hospital the same month.

The Absent Voters list 1919 confirmed that he lived in Macclesfield Road. His service number was 97625 and he was a Battery Sergeant Major, Royal Army Medical Corps, Com. Dept. Cotterics, Yorkshire.
