His Story

Guy was born 5th Nov 1888 in Marple and was living in 1891 at Rosefield House, Marple, aged 2.

He went to boarding school in Northill, Bedfordshire and after his education he took up a role as departmental manager at Hollins cotton mill whilst living at Cranage hall.

On the 20/8/1914 he married Honaria Marshall Rigby at Atcham, Shropshire.

He died in Nov 1974 at Newton Abbot, Devon.

His War Record

Guy Joined the Cheshire Artillery in October 1914 and in December 1914 he was reported to be ADC to General McLeod C.R.A. Welsh Division.

Between 17/7/1915 to 8/10/1915 he served in the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force.

Later he is also recorded as G A Carver, Major, acting Lieut. Colonel, Royal Artillery Territorial Force (Royal Horse and Royal Field Artillery).
