His Story

George Massey was born in 1892 in Holmes Chapel to Edward and Florence Ellen. In 1901 the family were living at Lane Ends, Holmes Chapel and George was aged 9. Edward was a Corn and Provision Merchant.

In 1911 the census shows that George, now aged 19 was living at 65 Broughton Road, Seacombe. He was a boarder and working as an apprentice miller.

His death is recorded in February 1959 at Crewe aged 67.

His War Record

George joined the Cheshire Yeomanry in October 1914.

In January 1917 he was reported in the Parish Magazine to be convalescing abroad but was discharged from hospital in February 1917.

In December 1917 he was granted a commission.

He was reported missing in April 1918 and in May discovered to be a prisoner in Germany unwounded and well.
