His Story

George was born in August 1878 in the Congleton District to Isaac and Alice Maybury. Isaac was a joiner.

In the 1891 census the family are living at Macclesfield Road, Holmes Chapel and George is aged 13 and working as an apprentice joiner.

By 1901 he was a blacksmith working in the Village, Holmes Chapel aged 22.

The census of 1911 shows he was still living in Macclesfield Road with his parents aged 32 and working as a blacksmith. According to the Land Tax records this was a house built in 1909 on the land of Sarah Benson

In May 1915 he married Mary Dakin and on the 20th April 1945 he was buried at Church Hulme aged 66. Up to that time he had been living at No. 10 Macclesfield Road.

His War Record

The Parish Magazine records that he enlisted into Royal Army Medical Corps in December 1915.
