## **His Story**

George was born in August 1878 in the Congleton District to Isaac and Alice Maybury. Isaac was a joiner.

In the 1891 census the family are living at Macclesfield Road, Holmes Chapel and George is aged 13 and working as an apprentice joiner.

By 1901 he was a blacksmith working in the Village, Holmes Chapel aged 22.

The census of 1911 shows he was still living in Macclesfield Road with his parents aged 32 and working as a blacksmith. According to the Land Tax records this was a house built in 1909 on the land of Sarah Benson

In May 1915 he married Mary Dakin and on the 20<sup>th</sup> April 1945 he was buried at Church Hulme aged 66. Up to that time he had been living at No. 10 Macclesfield Road.

## **His War Record**

The Parish Magazine records that he enlisted into Royal Army Medical Corps in December 1915.
