His Story

There are two Charles Moody in 1881 census aged 4 and 8, both are living with, and grandsons of, Charles Moody Snr, farmer of Brooklands Farm, Holmes Chapel.

By 1891 one Charles Moody is living at the Assembly Rooms Holmes Chapel, aged 18 and a general labourer. The other Charles is living at South View, Holmes Chapel and is a tailor's apprentice aged 14.

By 1901 there is only one Charles in Holmes Chapel, aged 28 and a railway signalman. The other Charles is now living in Ashton under Lyne where he is single aged 24 and a Tailor (journeyman).

By 1911 one Charles is living in Oxford St Manchester, single, and a railway porter aged 28. The other Charles is aged 34 and married in Ashton under Lyne working as a tailor.

We have assumed that the younger Moody is the one listed on the Roll of Honour.

His War Record

The Parish Magazine records that he joined the Army Service Corps in October 1914.
