His Story

Harry, son of Edward and Elizabeth Moss, was born in 1896 and by 1901 he was living with his grandparents, Edward and Ann Moss, at Allum Brook Cottages, Holmes Chapel, aged 5. His mother had died in 1897.

At the time of the 1911 census he was living at Cherry Tree Cottages, London Road, the house of his uncle, Henry Moss. He was now aged 15 and working as an apprentice baker.

His War Record

Harry Joined the King's Shropshire Light Infantry in October 1914 and was serving abroad by August 1915.

In November 1915 he was described as still in hospital but we do not know why. He was again in hospital in May 1917 and still in hospital in January 1918.

There were no further reports.

According to the Absent Voters of 1919 he was registered as living at Big Stone, Cranage and a Private with Nr. 16508, 2nd Kings Shropshire Light Infantry.
