His Story

Victor was the son of Eli and Harriet Pickstock and was born in February 1896 in Holmes Chapel.

In 1901 the family are still in the Village, Holmes Chapel and Victor is aged 4. His father as well as being the School Attendance Officer is a Builder and Contractor and the Parish Clerk.

By 1911 Victor was living at the house of Josiah and Mabel Royle, Victor's sister, in Holmes Chapel. In the same house is his father Eli Pickstock. Victor is aged 14 and employed as a plumber's apprentice.

In November 1921 he married Hilda Hardy in Congleton District.

His death is recorded in February 1967 at Crewe when he was aged 70.

His War Record

According to the Parish Magazine in October 1914 he joined the Scottish Horse Cavalry.

In October 1916 he was in hospital in England from which he left in February 1917.

In March 1917 he was recovered and fighting in Italy.

There was no further news.
