The house Greenacres, lived in by the Rosson family in 1911, was here but since demolished.



His Story

He was born in 1875 at Cranage, the son of William and Elizabeth Rosson. At the 1881 Census the family were at Swan Farm, Cranage; with Sydney, aged 6, at school.

At the 1891 Census the family were still at Swan farm. Sydney was probably working there for his father. By the time of the 1901 Census, Sydney was at Pecklow, Brereton, the house of Alfred Cliffe, his father-in-law, with his wife, Edith Annie Rosson.

In the 1911 Census the Rosson family of Sydney, Edith and their sons, Alfred William, aged 9 and Harold, aged 1½, were living at Green Bank, Holmes Chapel. Sydney was a farm worker.

His War Record

He joined the Cheshire Regiment in June 1915.

There are no further reports until the Absent Voters list of 1919 which shows that his registered address at this time was Station Road, Holmes Chapel.
