His Story

Glendore Vaughan was born in 1896, son of Thomas and Eliza Williams, in Holmes Chapel, one of four brothers who served in the war. He lived in the family grocery shop, the Cambrian Stores, which was situated next to the original George and Dragon Public House.

He was educated in the village and was working as an assistant grocer when the census was taken in 1911. He returned to the village after his wartime service and worked in the family grocery business.

His War Record

The Parish Magazine and Roll of Honour records that Glendore was called up into the Navy.

He was injured and in hospital during 1916, but was discharged in January 1917. He served until his demobilization on 27th November 1919.
